Apocalypse's Hemiaccoyo Sensei



Sensei (which means "teacher" in Japanese in a very revered sense) is a beige, full Hemiaccoyo two year old offspring of Apocalypse and Champion, full Accoyo, Sara's Sonora. Peruvian Sara, Sonora's dam, was the top pick of all females of the 1994 Peruvian importation. Believe it or not, we turned down an offer to trade three females for Sara, and this was a decision that was very easy to make. The offspring of Sara, her daughters, and all of the subsequent generations have never disappointed. The only son that Sara produced is the well-known Victor's Vaccoyo, who TIMBERLAND sold as a yearling to Gerry and Jane Tellier in Canada many years ago, and who is now back in the U.S. and residing on the East Coast. TIMBERLAND continues to hold onto most of the Sara/Victor line pedigree. This bloodline, of all the TIMBERLAND foundation stock, tends to have the greatest shear

weights of TIMBERLAND's alpacas, with the herd sires producing over 14 pounds of fleece each year, and the foundation females well over 10 pounds while pregnant and lactating. Sensei has done very well in his two years of showing: 2008 AWE (Level V) 1st Full Fleece Yearling Beige Males, 2008 Reserve Light Male Champion AWE, 2008 CABA Classic (Level IV) 1st Full Fleece Yearling Beige Males, 2009 Alpacapalooza (Level V) 1st Full Fleece Two Years and Older Light Males, 2009 Alpacapalooza Light Male Champion. From seven through nineteen months of age, Sensei's shear weight was nearly ten pounds, and we predict that his shearing weight for 2009 will exceed twelve pounds, so he is very much on track and comparable in fleece production to his sire, Apocalypse.
